1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 Introduction

India has had a long maritime tradition and the single principal factor contributing to this celebrated tradition is the presence of a strong, dedicated, efficient and reliable reservoir of officers and ratings of the Merchant Navy in India. The rising demand for Indian seafarers worldwide is a testimony to the quality of education and training imparted in India. However, of late, India has been facing a stiff challenge to her position in this regard from countries like Philippines, China and Bangladesh. Hence there is a need to further upgrade our training capacity and capabilities so that India stays ahead of the other nations in this sector and is able to meet the projected global shortage of over 27,000 officers by the year 2015.

The birth of Indian Maritime University (IMU) was a long cherished dream of the maritime community of India. The University, established through an Act of Parliament (Act No 22) in November 2008 as a Central University, is poised to play a key role in the development of trained human resource for the maritime sector. Indian Maritime University (IMU) came into existence on 14th November 2008 by subsuming even legacy institutions from four major port cities. The University now has six Campuses at major port cities of Chennai, Mumbai, Kolkata, Visakhapatnam, Kochin and Kandla (Gujarat) and a centre at Karaikal. IMU has stepped into its 7th year with renewed energy.

The University aims to achieve academic and research excellence in the three broad domains of maritime sector namely trade, Resources and security. This includes merchant navy, ship design, ship building and repair, ports and equipment, hinter and evacuation, supply chain management, offshore oil, seabed minerals, aquaculture and fisheries, coastal zone management, tourism, environmental sustainability, piracy, border management and hydrography.

The University is set to the following objectives:

- i) to facilitate and promote maritime studies, training, research and extension work with focus on emerging areas of studies like oceanography, maritime history, maritime laws, maritime security, search and rescue, transportation of dangerous cargo, environmental studies and other related fields and also to achieve excellence in these and connected fields and other matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.
- (ii) to promote advanced knowledge by providing institutional and research facilities in such branches of learning as it may deem fit and to make provisions for integrated courses in Science and other key and frontier areas of Technology and allied disciplines in the educational programs of the University;
- (iii) to take appropriate measures for promoting innovations in teaching-learning process, inter-disciplinary studies and research; and to pay special attention to the promotion of educational and economic interests and welfare of the people of India; (iv) to promote freedom, secularism, equality and social justice as enshrined in the Constitution of India and to act as catalyst in socio-economic transformation by promoting basic attitudes and values of essence to national development; and (v) to extend the benefits of knowledge and skills for development of individuals and society by associating the University closely with local, regional and national issues of development.

1.2 Campuses

The University was established initially with four Campuses namely, Chennai, Mumbai, Kolkata and Visakhapatnam. Cochin Campus was established in August2009. The Kandla Port Campus, with infrastructural support from Kandla Port, started functioning from academic year 2011-12 with one course named Diploma in Nautical Science leading to B.Sc (Nautical Science) Course. Karaikal Campus was started in January 2014.

1.3 Appointment of Vice Chancellor

Shri K. Ashok Vardhan Shetty joined as Vice Chancellor of IMU on 2nd January 2014.

1.4 Academic Programmes

All Academic Programmes of the University are offered under its Five Schools namely, School of Nautical Studies, School of Marine Engineering and Technology, School of Naval Architecture and Ocean Engineering, School of Maritime Management and School of Maritime Law.

1.5 Admission

A pass in the Common Entrance Test conducted by IMU is a mandatory requirement for admissions to all the Programmes in IMU Campuses as well as Affiliated Institutes. The total intake of students to various courses in IMU Campuses and affiliated institutions in 2013-14 was 4229. (Table 1.1) The University follows the reservation policy prescribed by Government of India.

The University also conducted Post-Sea Programmes and Management Development Programmes (MDP) in its various Campuses. During 2013-2014, the modular courses

and competency courses had a total participant strength of 7719 and 1818 respectively. The same year 2013-14, 44 Management Development Programmes were conducted and over 500 participants belonging to various Ports and non-Port organisations.

1.6 Conferences/Seminars/Workshops

- IMU Visakhapatnam Campus organized and hosted "Inspire Internship Science Camp" from 15th to 19th July 2013. Lectures on Scientific Topics delivered given by eminent scientists and by Chief Guest Prof. K.Satyanaryana. It also organised a Training Program on "Energy Management & Audit jointly with National Productivity Council", Hyderabad from 06.01.2014 to 10.01.2014. 22 paper presentations in various conferences /seminars were made by Faculty.
- IMU Mumbai Campus conducted many in-house seminars and its Faculty presented papers in four maritime National conferences at Mumbai.
- IMU Cochin Campus arranged a field trip in which the MBA students visited Inland Container Depot (ICD), Whitefield, Bangalore. They also visited Port Blair, Andaman and Nicobar Islands in March 2014.
- IMU Chennai Campus organised a National Seminar and Management Fest "Estuary 2014" in March 2014, the finals of which were held in April 2014.
- The School of Marine Engineering and Technology conducted a National Level
 Symposium "NATATORIAL-2013" on 24th& 25th Oct 2013.
- IMU Kolkata Campus conducted a Workshop for young Investors on 27th October, 2013 for final year cadets. Another Workshop on Financial Education was held by SEBI on 10th November, 2013 for final year students.

1.6.1 Research Projects and Consultancy

In all the five Schools of IMU, Faculty members are encouraged to publish papers in their respective areas of interest and also to undertake Research projects and Consultancy work.

The details of Research and Consultancy Projects which were undertaken during 2013-14 are as follows:

- (a) Chennai Campus 3 Consultancy Projects.
- (b) Visakhapatnam Campus 15 Research Projects and 6Consultancy Projects.
- (c) Kolkata Campus 5Consultancy Projects.

1.6.2 Publications

The University brings out an in-house quarterly journal named "IMU-Voyage". The School of Maritime Management also publishes an in-house bimonthly journal called 'Stimulus'.

1.6.3 Training Cell

Chennai, Mumbai, Kolkata and Vishakhapatnam Campuses possess fully equipped training cells. During 2013-14, at IMU-Mumbai Campus, LBS College of Advanced Maritime Studies and Research conducted 36 post sea courses and 5 training programmes. R &D cell of IMU-Kolkata Campus conducted 12 Management Development Programmes, 12 on-site programmes at various major Ports and 38 Competency and Modular Courses. Four IES training programmes and two seminars were organized by the School of Maritime Management (location) and 12 post-sea programmes were conducted at Chennai Campus.

1.7 Library

Each Campus has a well-equipped library, which caters to the needs of Faculty members and students. The Visakhapatnam Campus Library is fully digitized. Initiatives have been taken to digitize all the libraries. The Visakhapatnam Campus also has an exclusive collection of drawings pertaining to Ship Designing. The library uses an integrated library management software LIBSYS for various library functions and LS Digital for managing digital resources. IMU Kolkata has an excellent library with one of the finest collections of books and journals in Port and Shipping Management.

1.8 Finance

Till the end of financial year 2013-14 IMU received Plan fund of Rs.256.45 crores. The total recurring expenditure of IMU was Rs. 73.53 crores and total revenue generated was Rs.78.38 crores during 2013-14.

1.9 Affiliated Institutions

For the period 2013-14, the following 36 Institutions/ Colleges were provisionally affiliated, for specific courses mentioned against their names, to the University.

1.10 Infrastructure Development

- **1.10.1** The following works were carried out at IMU Headquarters, Semmancherry through Central Public Works Department (CPWD).
- a) Construction of Compound wall along the western periphery and east-west direction of southern periphery to a length of 2.1 km at an estimated cost of Rs.4.61 Crore.

- b) Construction of Administrative Building Block "A" with a total plinth area of 2300 sq.m was completed which consists of multi-purpose hall on the ground floor and a Library and Computer Centre on the first floor.
- c) Construction of Administrative Building Block "B" with a plinth area of 2000 sq.m block accommodating various offices including those of the Vice Chancellor, Registrar, Finance Officer and Controller of Examinations and their respective Secretariats area which is in advanced stage of completion.
- d) Construction of Academic Block with plinth area of 2160 sq.m consisting of ten class rooms of each of thirty students capacity, Head of department, faculty rooms, computer centre and seminar hall.
- e) Construction of Hostels for Boys and Girls with an area of 2835 sq.m each with an accommodative capacity of 120 and 80 respectively.
- f) Construction of electrical sub-station, CPWD site office, provision of WBM Radial Road from west side entry of IMU site to Administrative Buildings, sump& Sewage Treatment Plant.

1.10.2 a) Works In Progress

- Construction of Approach Bridge over Buckingham canal from East Coast Road to IMU site work was in progress.
- ii) Construction of Compound wall along North -East and South -East of IMU site.
- iii) Construction of internal roads, foot paths, rain water harvesting and horticultural works were under progress.

b) Development Works - Under Planning Stage

- (i) Construction of Vice Chancellor Bungalow, Residence for Registrar, Finance officer and Controller of Examinations and quarters for Deputy Registrars and Engineers.
- (ii) Construction of compound wall along the Eastern periphery of IMU land.

1.10.3 IMU Chennai Campus

a) New Marine Hostel of G+1 structure with a plinth area of 19,600 sq.ft was constructed for exclusive accommodation of Marine Engineering students. The hostel has sixteen

rooms on the ground floor and twenty rooms on the first floor and has a total accommodating capacity of 216 students with planned capacity of six students in each room. There are twenty toilets – cum – bathrooms on each floor.

- b) Annex building to the New Marine Hostel was constructed with provision of kitchen, VIP dining room at the ground floor and a dining hall with a capacity of 250 students at the first floor. Kitchen was set up with steam boilers, exhaust duct and with modern kitchen equipment.
- c) One RO plant was installed in New Marine Hostel for purifying water.

1.10.4 IMU Mumbai Campus

Works undertaken during 2013-2014 were as follows:

- a) ECDIS Simulators were being commissioned at T.S. Chanakya and L.B.S.C.A.M.S.A.R.
- b) Construction of OBC hostel at T.S. Chanakya

1.10.5 IMU Kolkata Campus

- a) The construction work of first phase of the new hostel block for OBC students was completed (G+1) and put into use for cadets (172 cadets were accommodated upon completion of the first phase of construction). Kitchen and dining were planned for subsequent space commissioning for cadets messing. Phase-II 2nd and 3rd floor construction was started.
- b) The construction of first phase of Academic and Administrative building for OBC students (G+1) completed.
- c) Construction of new accommodation (1331 Sq.m.) between Junior Hostel and Rear-Wing completed.
- d) New Diesel Generator set was installed and commissioned.

1.10.6 IMU Vishakhapatnam Campus

- a) IMU entered into a MOU with National Building Construction Corporation (NBCC) for the construction of the new Campus building in an area of 109 acres.
- b) NBCC issued a Tender notification inviting prospective contractors for the construction of compound wall.

1.10.7 IMU Cochin Campus

- a) The Campus Library has been equipped with 2400 books, 31 magazines and 12 print journals. The library has facility to access online resources.
- b) The main building and workshop were under construction.

1.12 Scholarships and Concessions

IMU and its six Campuses extend all the requisite support to its students for obtaining educational loans from nationalized banks. The girl students are given waiver of tuition fee to the tune of Rs.79,500/- for the DNS course and Rs. 82,000/- (per Annum) for the B.Tech programme. Apart from this, scholarship from Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India, and also the concerned State Government scholarships for SC/ST students are obtained through the University.

1.13 Students' Welfare

IMU Campuses offer medical and health care facilities for both students and staff. All

the students of the University are covered under Group Insurance Scheme (Personal Accident Policy) up to of Rs.2 lakhs per student. Since the Marine and Nautical

Courses are residential Courses, both indoor and outdoor game facilities are available

at all Campuses. The opportunity for participation in extra-curricular activities is also

facilitated across the Campuses.

1.14 **Placements**

IMU is now in its sixth year and takes necessary steps for placement of students of all

its Campuses. Reputed shipping Companies. Liners, Logistics and other service

providers are the ones who recruit from IMU.

1.15 Awards

Students of IMU Campuses participated in various types of professional and

extracurricular activities won various trophies, cups and awards of academic and

industrial repute at Inter University and other levels.

1.16 Official Language Implementation Committee

The University has established a committee named, Official Language Implementation

Committee with the objective to promote Hindi in the day to day administrative

activities. Employees are encouraged to communicate in Hindi.

1.17 First Convocation

Although IMU was started on 14.11.2008, no Convocation was held for over 5

years.IMU's First Convocation was held on 22nd February 2014 and was graced by Shri

Pranab Mukherji, the President of India who delivered the Convocation Address. 1339

candidates, from the 2009-10 batches onwards, who had passed all their examinations

before the 31st October 2013, were awarded U.G Degrees, P.G Degrees and P.G

Diplomas.



The mission of library is to support and supplement learning, teaching and research programmes. The MERI Unit has got a collection of around 16000 books and subscribes 50 print journals. IIPM Library has got a collection of approximately 7050 books, print journals- 20, book database (7050 approx.), Study Materials database (1087) and Video CDs- 75.
