

	He is the Chairman of the Academic Council of Narottam Morarjee Institute of Shipping and also the Chairman of the Research & Training Committee of the Indian National Shipowners Association. Currently he is also the Chairman of the Narottam Morarjee Institute of Shipping.
	He is an Associate Editor of the technical journal of the Institution of Engineers (India) published by Springer.
	Shri Dilip Mehrotra joined the Indian Maritime Administration in 1992. In the year 2000, he obtained his Masters Degree in the Maritime Safety Environment Protection from the World Maritime University, Malmo, Sweden.
